This guide sets out a brief summary of the ITIA Provisional Suspension process, for your reference. You have 10 business days to decide whether to appeal this decision.

We strongly recommend you urgently seek legal advice. You or your advisers should also refer to the accompanying letter and the TACP which take precedence over this summary document.

The ITIA believes you have committed an Offense under the TACP.
The accompanying letter notifies you that the ITIA has provisionally suspended you and outlines the reasons that this has been imposed. (See paragraph B of the accompanying letter)

Under section F. 3 of the TACP, having been provisionally suspended you are now prohibited from competing in or attending any sanctioned tennis events organised by the governing bodies of the sport.


There is no right to appeal the AHO decision for either you or the ITIA.
