

The ITIA believes you have committed an Offense under the TACP.

The accompanying letter notifies you that the ITIA has provisionally suspended you and outlines the reasons that this has been imposed.

(See **paragraph B** of the accompanying letter)

Under section F.3 of the TACP, having been provisionally suspended you are now prohibited from competing in or attending any sanctioned tennis events organised by the governing bodies of the sport.

The Provisional Suspension is effective IMMEDIATELY.

You may appeal your Provisional Suspension within 10 business days of receiving this letter by notifying cases@itia.tennis including reasons and any supporting evidence.

The ITIA may reply to your notice of appeal within 5 business days. The ITIA will refer your appeal to an Anti-Corruption Hearing Officer (AHO) who will decide on your appeal.

Your suspension will remain in place for the duration of this process.

Appeal process conducted by the AHO.

Provisional Suspension lifted.

The Provisional Suspension remains in place until further notice.

You must not attend or participate in any sanctioned tennis events organised by the governing bodies of the sport.

You may return to attending and participating in sanctioned tennis events organised by the governing bodies of the sport.

There is no right to appeal the AHO decision for either you or the ITIA.
