

This guide sets out a brief summary of the ITIA Provisional Suspension process, for your reference. You have 10 business days to decide whether to appeal this decision.

We strongly recommend you urgently seek legal advice. You or your advisers should also refer to the accompanying letter and the TACP which take precedence over this summary document.

The ITIA believes you have committed an Offense under the TACP.

The accompanying letter notifies you that the ITIA has provisionally suspended you and outlines the reasons that this has been imposed.

(See paragraph B of the accompanying letter)

Under section F.3 of the TACP, having been provisionally suspended you are now prohibited from competing in or attending any sanctioned tennis events organised by the governing bodies of the sport.

The Provisional Suspension is effective IMMEDIATELY. Do you accept the suspension? You may appeal your Provisional Suspension within 10 business days of receiving this letter by notifying cases@itia.tennis including reasons and any supporting evidence. The ITIA may reply to your notice of appeal within 5 business days. The ITIA will refer your appeal to an Anti-Corruption Hearing Officer (AHO) who will decide on your appeal. Your suspension will remain in place for the duration of this process. Appeal process conducted by the AHO. The Provisional Suspension remains in place until further notice. Provisional Suspension lifted. You may return to attending and You must not attend or participate in any sanctioned tennis events participating in sanctioned tennis organised by the governing bodies events organised by the governing of the sport. bodies of the sport.

There is no right to appeal the AHO decision for either you or the ITIA.
